prevention, including regular skin checks, consistent sunscreen use, and protective

clothing, can reduce the risk of developing skin cancer; and

WHEREAS: Researchers, healthcare professionals, and advocacy organizations continue to work

hard to educate the public on skin cancer prevention, develop advanced treatments,

and support those affected by skin cancer; and

WHEREAS: An increased number of public awareness campaigns and community initiatives are

essential to reducing the prevalence of skin cancer and encouraging healthy habits to

protect skin health; and

WHEREAS: To raise awareness about skin cancer prevention and support for those impacted, the

> Skin Cancer Awareness campaign, focusses on educating the community about the importance of protection from UV radiation and ways to protect themselves; now
