## A PROCLAMATION

### TESTICULAR CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

- WHEREAS:** Testicular cancer is the leading cancer in men between ages 15 to 44, although it can occur at any age from infancy to elderly; and
- WHEREAS:** According to Testicular Cancer Awareness Foundation, approximately 9,720 individuals will be diagnosed in 2025 with testicular cancer in the United States; and
- WHEREAS:** According to Testicular Cancer Awareness Foundation, approximately 600 deaths will occur in 2025 caused by testicular cancer in the United States; and
- WHEREAS:** Public awareness can increase early detection; and
- WHEREAS:** If detected early, testicular cancer is over 95% curable; and
- WHEREAS:** Early-stage testicular cancer can be detected by performing monthly self-exams; and
- WHEREAS:** It is important to recognize those that have been affected by testicular cancer; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim April 2025, as TESTICULAR CANCER AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
