A PROCLAMATION

XLH AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS: X-Linked Hypophosphatemia (XLH) is a rare chronic genetic disorder that affects the

bones, joints, teeth, hearing, muscles and nervous system. Approximately one in 20,000 newborns are diagnosed with XLH, according to the National Institutes of

Health (NIH); and

WHEREAS: The effects of the disease cause serious debilitating symptoms that have a major impact

on the lives those with XLH and their families; and

WHEREAS: Patients with XLH and their families often encounter a variety of issues outside the

illness itself, such as difficulty in obtaining accurate and timely diagnoses, finding effective treatment options, and affording appropriate and necessary treatment; and

WHEREAS: XLH is not a curable disease. However, dedicated researchers around the world

continue their efforts in the hope that a cure will be found in the future; and

WHEREAS: Public educational programs are necessary for new parents and health providers to be

made aware of the most up-to-date information. Organizations such as The XLH

Network Inc. aim to support caregivers and those affected by XLH; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim June 23,

2025, as XLH AWARENESS DAY in Georgia.
