A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Article 3 of Chapter 2 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 1 2 relating to prestige license plates and special plates for certain persons and vehicles, so as to 3 provide for the issuance of two free license plates for veterans who are totally disabled or 4 disabled; to provide for application; to provide for conforming changes; to establish a 5 specialty license plate honoring the Shepherd Center; to establish a specialty license plate 6 benefiting the Georgia Veterans Service Foundation; to establish a specialty license plate 7 honoring Southern University Alumni; to establish a specialty license plate honoring Delta 8 Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.; to establish a specialty license plate honoring alumni of Alabama 9 State University; to establish a specialty license plate supporting the state parks and historic 10 sites division of the Department of Natural Resources; to establish a specialty license plate 11 promoting conservation and enhancement of black bass populations; to provide for related 12 matters; to provide for effective dates; to provide for compliance with constitutional 13 requirements; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

H. B. 208 - 1 - Article 3 of Chapter 2 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to prestige license plates and special plates for certain persons and vehicles, is amended by revising Code Section 40-2-69, relating to license plates for veterans qualifying as totally disabled, as follows:

20 "40-2-69.

(a) Any disabled veteran who is a citizen and resident of this state shall, upon application
therefor, be issued a free motor vehicle license plate. As used in this Code section, the
term 'disabled veteran' shall have the same meaning as that term is defined in 'totally
disabled veteran' means an individual who qualifies as a disabled veteran pursuant to
paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of Code Section 48-5-48.

(b) Any <u>totally</u> disabled veteran shall, upon <u>proper</u> application therefor, be issued a free
motor vehicle license <u>plate</u> <u>plates for up to two motorcycles or passenger cars for personal</u>
<u>use registered pursuant to this chapter in his or her name</u> upon presentation of proof that
he or she qualifies as a <u>totally</u> disabled veteran. A <u>totally</u> disabled veteran who claims that
his or her disability is permanent <u>applying for license plates pursuant to this Code section</u>
shall furnish proof of such permanent disability through a letter from the United States
Department of Veterans Affairs.

33 (c)(1) Once a totally disabled veteran has established his or her eligibility to receive free 34 motor vehicle license plates as a result of being permanently disabled pursuant to this 35 Code section, he or she shall be entitled to receive free license plates or free revalidation 36 decals in succeeding years on any automobile, private passenger pickup truck, 37 motorcycle, station wagon, or van type vehicle of three-quarter tons or less for up to two 38 motorcycles or passenger cars for personal use registered pursuant to this chapter that he 39 or she may own or jointly with his or her spouse or minor child own or acquire in the 40 future.

41 (2) Once a disabled veteran has established his or her eligibility to receive free motor
 42 vehicle license plates but his or her disability has not been determined to be a permanent

disability, he or she shall be entitled to receive free plates or free revalidation decals in
succeeding years upon furnishing, on an annual basis, proof of his or her status as a
disabled veteran through a letter from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.
Such free plates or free revalidation decals shall apply to any automobile, private
passenger pickup truck, motorcycle, station wagon, or van type vehicle of three-quarter
tons or less that he or she may own or jointly with his or her spouse or minor child own
or acquire in the future.

- 50 (3)(2)(A) Up to two Two license plates or revalidation decals each year shall be
 51 furnished for motor vehicles other than motorcycles to totally disabled veterans
 52 qualifying under this Code section unless the originals are lost. Such plates license
 53 plate shall be fastened to both the front and the rear of the motor vehicle.
- (B) <u>Up to two license plates or revalidation decals</u> One license plate or revalidation
 decal each year shall be furnished for motorcycles to <u>totally</u> disabled veterans
 qualifying under this Code section unless the original is lost. Such <u>license</u> plate shall
 be fastened to the rear of the <u>motor</u> vehicle.
- 58 (4)(3) In the event of the death of the person who received the special license plates 59 pursuant to this Code section, upon complying with the motor vehicle laws relating to 60 registration and licensing of motor vehicles, his or her unremarried surviving spouse or 61 minor child may continue to receive the free special license plates <u>authorized by this</u> 62 <u>Code section</u> and revalidation decals until the remarriage of the surviving spouse or death 63 of the surviving spouse or minor child."

SECTION 2.

Said article is further amended by revising Code Section 40-2-70, relating to license plates
for veterans not qualifying as totally disabled, as follows:

*67 "*40-2-70.

68 (a) Any citizen and resident of the State of Georgia this state who has been discharged 69 from the armed forces under conditions other than dishonorable or who is currently serving 70 in the armed forces, who is disabled to any degree specified and enumerated in Code Section 40-2-69, and who is the owner of a private passenger motor vehicle, but who 71 72 cannot qualify under but does not qualify as totally disabled pursuant to paragraph (1) of 73 subsection (a) of Code Section 48-5-48 for purposes of qualification for a license plate 74 issued pursuant to Code Section 40-2-69, shall be entitled to a special and distinctive 75 automobile license plate license plates for up to two motorcycles or passenger cars for 76 personal use registered pursuant to this chapter in his or her name. Such license plate plates shall be transferred to another vehicle acquired by such veteran or jointly by such 77 78 veteran and his or her spouse as provided in Code Section 40-2-80. Such veteran shall be 79 entitled to such plate license plates issued pursuant to this Code section regardless of whether he or she is suffering from a service connected or nonservice connected disability. 80 81 (b) Upon proper application and Such veteran must apply for such license plate and, upon compliance with the state motor vehicle laws for licensing of motor vehicles and without 82 83 payment of the regular license fee for plates as prescribed under Article 7 of this chapter, 84 such veteran a disabled veteran who does not qualify for license plates pursuant to Code 85 Section 40-2-69 shall be issued similar license plates as prescribed in Code Section 40-2-71 86 for private passenger cars up to two motorcycles or passenger cars for personal use. There 87 shall be no charge for the additional plate issued such veteran under this Code section. 88 There shall be no charge for revalidation decals for such plates license plates issued 89 pursuant to this Code section. 90 (c) For purposes of applying for license plates issued pursuant to this Code section, If a

 discharge papers and a certified statement from a physician, licensed under Chapter 34 of
 Title 43, certifying that, in the opinion of such physician, such veteran is disabled to a

If the certificate from the physician indicates 96 the qualifying disabilities which meet the standards of the United States Department of 97 Veterans Affairs, the commissioner of veterans service shall submit a letter to the state 98 revenue commissioner indicating that the veteran meets the requirements of this Code 99 section and qualifies for a special license plate <u>plates</u> as provided in this Code section.

100 (d) Once a disabled veteran has established his or her eligibility to receive free motor 101 vehicle license plates pursuant to this Code section but his or her disability has not been 102 determined to be a permanent disability, he or she shall be entitled to receive free license plates or free revalidation decals in succeeding years upon furnishing, on an annual basis, 103 104 proof of his or her status as a disabled veteran through a letter from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. Such free license plates or free revalidation decals shall 105 be for up to two motorcycles or passenger cars for personal use registered pursuant to this 106 chapter that he or she may own or jointly with his or her spouse or minor child own or 107 108 acquire in the future."

Sections 40-2-69 and 40-2-70. Such plates shall be printed in three colors: red, white, and
blue. The commissioner is authorized and directed to design the license plate. Each
<u>license plate shall contain, in bold characters, the name of the state, or abbreviation thereof,</u>
the year, the serial number, either the words 'Disabled Veteran' or 'Disabled Vet,' and an
image of the International Symbol of Access which is at least one inch in height and is
white on a blue background.

SECTION 6.

160 In accordance with the requirements of Article III, Section IX, Paragraph VI(n) of the 161 Constitution of the State of Georgia, this Act shall not become law unless it receives the 162 requisite two-thirds' majority vote in both the Senate and the House of Representatives.

H. B. 208 - 7 - 168 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
