- 1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution so as to increase the maximum acreage to
- 2 qualify for assessment and taxation as a bona fide conservation use property; to provide for
- 3 related matters; to provide for the submission of this amendment for ratification or rejection;

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

7 Article VII, Section I, Paragraph III of the Constitution is amended by revising 8 subparagraph (e)(1) as follows:

- "(e) The General Assembly shall provide by general law:
- (1) For the definition and methods of assessment and taxation, such methods to include a formula based on current use, annual productivity, and real property sales data, of: 'bona fide conservation use property' to include bona fide agricultural and timber land not to exceed 2,000 4,000 acres of a single owner; and 'bona fide residential transitional property;' to include private single-family residential owner occupied property located in transitional developing areas not to exceed five acres of any single owner. Such methods of assessment and taxation shall be subject to the following conditions:

17 (A) A property owner desiring the benefit of such methods of assessment and 18 taxation shall be required to enter into a covenant to continue the property in bona fide 19 conservation use or bona fide residential transitional use; and 20 (B) A breach of such covenant within ten years shall result in a recapture of the tax 21 savings resulting from such methods of assessment and taxation and may result in other appropriate penalties;" 22 23 **SECTION 2.** 24 The above proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be published and submitted as 25 provided in Article X, Section I, Paragraph II of the Constitution. The ballot submitting the 26 above proposed amendment shall have written or printed thereon the following: 27 "( ) YES Shall the Constitution of Georgia, for the purpose of protecting family 28 ( ) NO farmland, be amended so as to increase the maximum acreage to qualify for 29 assessment and taxation as a bona fide conservation use property from 2,000 acres to 4,000 acres?" 30 31 All persons desiring to vote in favor of ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "Yes." All persons desiring to vote against ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "No." If 32 33 such amendment shall be ratified as provided in said Paragraph of the Constitution, it shall

become a part of the Constitution of this state.
