A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 1 of Title 10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to selling 1 and other trade practices, so as to extend certain protections for consumers relative to 2 3 warranties of HVAC systems and components of such systems; to allow for transfers of 4 certain manufacturers' warranties of HVAC systems and components of such systems; to 5 prohibit manufacturers', distributors', and retailers' warranties of HVAC systems and 6 components of such systems from being conditioned upon product registration; to provide 7 required information for warranty and product registration cards and forms; to provide an 8 effective date for certain warranties of HVAC systems and components of such systems; to 9 provide a definition; to provide for an effective date and applicability; to provide for related 10 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 13 Chapter 1 of Title 10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to selling and other
- 14 trade practices, is amended by adding a new article to read as follows:

- 17 As used in this article, the term 'HVAC' means heating, ventilation, and air-conditioning.

- 19 (a) If a residential real property that includes an HVAC system as a fixture to the property
- is conveyed to a new owner, any manufacturer's warranty in effect on that system or any
- 21 <u>component of that system:</u>
- 22 (1) Shall be automatically transferred to the new owner; and
- 23 (2) Shall continue in effect as if the new owner was the original purchaser of such system
- 24 <u>or component, as applicable.</u>
- 25 (b) A manufacturer shall continue to be obligated under the terms of any warranty
- 26 <u>transferred pursuant to subsection (a) of this Code section and shall not charge a fee for the</u>
- transfer of such warranty.
- 28 (c) A transfer of any manufacturer's warranty pursuant to subsection (a) of this Code
- 29 <u>section shall not extend the remaining term of the warranty.</u>

- 31 (a) The full term of a manufacturer's, distributor's, or retailer's warranty of an HVAC
- 32 system or any component of such system shall be effective in this state on the date of
- installation if installed by a contractor licensed under Chapter 14 of Title 43.
- 34 (b) If a manufacturer, distributor, or retailer of an HVAC system or any component of such
- 35 system provides a warranty or product registration card or form, or an electronic, online
- 36 warranty or product registration form, the card or form shall contain the following
- information, displayed in a clear and conspicuous manner:
- 38 (1) The card or form is for registration of the product; and

39 (2) Failure to complete and return the card or form shall not diminish any warranty rights

- or decrease the warranty term.
- 41 (c) Any warranty of an HVAC system or any component of such system manufactured and
- 42 <u>issued</u>, sold, or offered for sale by a manufacturer, distributor, or retailer shall not be in any
- 43 way conditioned upon product registration."
- 44 SECTION 2.
- 45 (a) This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2026.
- 46 (b) This Act shall apply to any warranty of an HVAC system or any component of such
- 47 system manufactured and issued, sold, or offered for sale by a manufacturer, distributor, or
- 48 retailer on or after the effective date of this Act and to any modifications or extensions of
- 49 such warranties issued, sold, or offered for sale on or after such date.
- 50 SECTION 3.
- 51 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
