A PROCLAMATION
CONSTITUTION WEEK

WHEREAS: The Constitution of the United States of America, signed on September 17, 1787, established the framework of our federal government and continues to secure the blessings of liberty through the enduring principles of representative government, separation of powers, checks and balances, and the rule of law; and

WHEREAS: The State of Georgia holds a distinguished place in our nation’s constitutional history, being the fourth state to ratify the Constitution, demonstrating an early commitment to the principles upon which our Republic was founded; and

WHEREAS: Constitution Week commemorates the signing of the Constitution, and in 2026, marks the two hundred thirty-ninth anniversary of this historic document, while honoring the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence; and

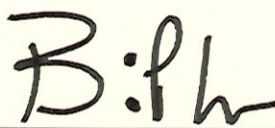
WHEREAS: The Georgia State Society-- The National Society Daughters of the American Revolution-- initiated the observance of Constitution Week in 1955, leading to its official establishment by Congressional resolution and Presidential proclamation in 1956 and continues to uphold this longstanding tradition today; and

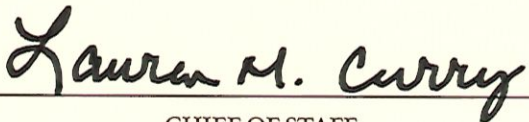
