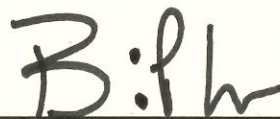
A PROCLAMATION

ENERGY EFFICIENCY DAY

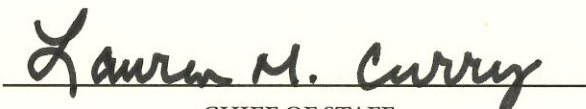
- WHEREAS:** The American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) supports improving the energy performance of new and existing buildings, including through its research, standards, publishing and continuing education; and
- WHEREAS:** ANSI/ASHRAE/IES Standard 90.1 has served as the benchmark for commercial building energy codes in the United States and as a key basis for codes and standards worldwide for over 35 years; and
- WHEREAS:** Improved energy codes for homes and commercial buildings also significantly reduce utility costs and create new jobs, and Georgia supports increasing building energy efficiency through the adoption of more up-to-date date codes and standards, including ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2021 and the model 2024 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC); and
- WHEREAS:** A nationwide network of energy efficiency groups and partners has designated the first Wednesday in October as Energy Efficiency Day; and
- WHEREAS:** Together, the residents of the State of Georgia can continue contributing to our sustainability efforts by learning more about energy efficiency and practicing smarter energy use in their daily lives; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim October 7, 2026, as ENERGY EFFICIENCY DAY in Georgia.
