A PROCLAMATION

INTERSTITIAL LUNG DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS: Interstitial lung disease (ILD) refers to a group of disorders that cause inflammation

and scarring of the lung tissue, leading to reduced oxygen exchange, shortness of

breath, and impaired quality of life; and

WHEREAS: ILD includes conditions from environmental and occupational exposures, certain

medications, autoimmune diseases, radiation, as well as idiopathic forms like idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis, each posing unique challenges for diagnosis and care; and

pulmonary horosis, each posing unique chancinges for diagnosis and care, and

WHEREAS: Early signs—such as persistent dry cough, exertional breathlessness, and finger

clubbing—require prompt evaluation, with high-resolution CT scans, pulmonary

function tests, and lab assessments aiding early detection; and

WHEREAS: Preventive steps, including avoiding harmful exposures, quitting smoking, careful

monitoring of medications, and managing autoimmune conditions, can reduce disease

progression and preserve lung function; and

WHEREAS: Available treatments—anti-inflammatory and immunosuppressive drugs, antifibrotic

therapies, oxygen support, pulmonary rehabilitation, and lung transplantation for

advanced cases—can improve quality of life and outcomes; and

WHEREAS: Ongoing research, clinical trials, and public education play a key role in advancing

understanding, developing new therapies, and supporting individuals and families

affected by ILD; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby February 2026, as

INTERSTITIAL LUNG DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
