OVARIAN CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

- WHEREAS:** Ovarian cancer is a disease that impacts over 21,000 additional American women each year, with over half of those women tragically losing their lives to its effects; and
- WHEREAS:** Experts have found that regular pelvic exams reduce the risk of detecting ovarian cancer too late, providing those diagnosed with more treatment options and a higher chance of remission; and
- WHEREAS:** Gynecologic oncologists are available across the State of Georgia to assist women on their journeys to living happier and healthier lives and are all equipped with excellent reproductive medical skills capable of saving lives, especially if the cancer is caught in an early stage; and
- WHEREAS:** An increase in awareness of the tragic effects of ovarian cancer and the available preventative measures among patients and healthcare providers alike are key components of safeguarding the health of women across Georgia; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim September 2026, as OVARIAN CANCER AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
