- WHEREAS:** Individuals under pretrial, probation, and parole supervision are provided structured oversight, access to services, and opportunities to make positive and responsible choices; and
- WHEREAS:** Pretrial, Probation, and Parole Supervision Week offers an opportunity to recognize the professionalism, dedication, and service of these public servants in strengthening communities throughout the State; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim July 19-25, 2026, as PRETRIAL, PROBATION, AND PAROLE SUPERVISION WEEK in Georgia.
