A PROCLAMATION

REENTRY AWARENESS MONTH

- WHEREAS:** Over 4.5 million Georgians, representing nearly 40% to 50% of Georgias adult population, have a criminal record on file with the Georgia Crime Information Center resulting in them facing collateral consequences of their incarceration; and
- WHEREAS:** Returning to the community after incarceration is a difficult transition, and an effective reentry process is vital to providing those in Georgias corrections systems with renewed opportunities for success; and
- WHEREAS:** Successful reentry empowers returning citizens to refrain from crime and incentivizes law-abiding behavior, thus supporting public safety throughout the State; and
- WHEREAS:** Supporting and bringing awareness to the challenges and successes of reentry restores families, builds stronger communities, and eliminates obstacles that prevent returning citizens from finding meaningful employment and housing; and
- WHEREAS:** By eliminating negative stigmas associated with having a criminal record, supporting inclusiveness and promoting redemption, compassion and kindness, we can help returning citizens thrive and achieve brighter futures; and
- WHEREAS:** Georgias efforts in providing pathways to remove barriers to employment and housing and offering returning citizens access to resources that assist and support them upon reentry are commendable; and
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim July 2026, as REENTRY AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
