
A PROCLAMATION


RONALD REAGAN DAY

- WHEREAS:** President Ronald Wilson Reagan, a man of humble background, having been employed as an entertainer, Union leader, governor of California and president of the United States; and
- WHEREAS:** Reagan served for two terms as the 40th president of the United States of America; the second of which he earned the confidence of three-fifths of the electorate and was victorious in 49 of the 50 states in the general election – a record unsurpassed in the history of American presidential elections; and
- WHEREAS:** In 1981, when Reagan was inaugurated President, he inherited a disillusioned nation shackled by rampant inflation and high unemployment; and
- WHEREAS:** Reagan’s sunny optimism and strong belief in the power of the individual revitalized the nation in one of the longest economic expansions in American history; and
- WHEREAS:** Reagan’s commitment to our armed forces allowed America to achieve “peace through strength,” and prepared America’s Armed Forces to meet 21st century challenges; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim February 6<sup>th</sup>, 2026, as RONALD REAGAN DAY in Georgia.
