

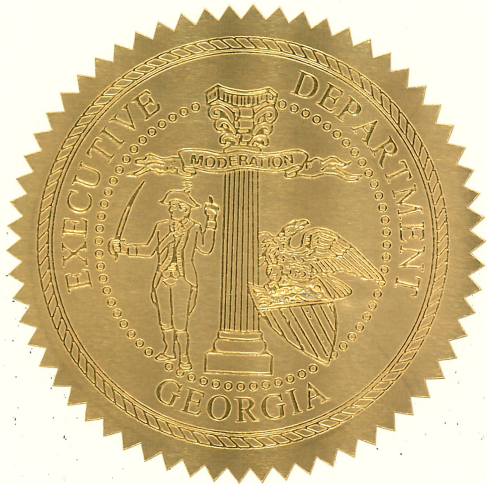

A PROCLAMATION

SAFETY MONTH

- WHEREAS:** Educating on continuous safety improvement, employee engagement, roadway safety, and worker wellbeing remain critical to preventing injuries and deaths in the State of Georgia; and
- WHEREAS:** The cost of unintentional injuries to workers and their employers exceeds \$167 billion in the United States each year and causes great suffering among individuals and their families; and
- WHEREAS:** Georgia workers deserve to live in communities that promote safe and healthy living. Preventing unintentional injuries and deaths requires the cooperation of all levels of government, employers, and the public; and
- WHEREAS:** The National Safety Council Southeastern Chapter works to promote policies, practices, and procedures leading to increased safety, protection and health in business and industry, in schools and colleges, on roads and highways, and in homes and communities; and
- WHEREAS:** The summer season is a time of increased rates of unintentional injuries and deaths, it is an appropriate time to focus attention on injury risks and prevention; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim June 2026, as SAFETY MONTH in Georgia.
