## A PROCLAMATION

### TBC BLOOD DONOR MONTH

- WHEREAS:** A steady blood supply is essential to maintaining hospitals' ability to provide lifesaving blood products for patients; and
- WHEREAS:** One blood donation has the potential to save up to three lives; and
- WHEREAS:** Every two seconds someone in the United States needs a blood transfusion; and
- WHEREAS:** An estimated one in every seven patients will need a blood transfusion in a hospital; and
- WHEREAS:** An estimated sixty percent of the United States population is eligible to donate blood, but less than three percent do; and
- WHEREAS:** National Blood Donor Month serves as an important reminder to maintain a sufficient blood supply through volunteer donors; and
- WHEREAS:** Healing happens when communities share blood, individuals thrive and families remain whole; and
- WHEREAS:** The Blood Connection, whose mission is to provide local healthcare partners with safe, adequate and cost-effective blood supplies and services, operates three community blood centers across the state of Georgia, from Augusta to Savannah and supported by more than 60 bloodmobiles throughout its four-state service area, including its newly expanded blood distribution and operations center in Augusta; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim January, 2026, as TBC BLOOD DONOR MONTH in Georgia.
