## EXECUTIVE ORDER

## BY THE GOVERNOR:

WHEREAS: On June 14, 2019, a committee consisting of Attorney General Chris Carr, Sheriff

Neal Jump of Glynn County, and Sheriff Jud Smith of Barrow County was formed to investigate "criminal charges, alleged misconduct in office, or alleged incapacity" as it related to the May 29, 2019, arrest of Bacon County Sheriff Mark

Cothren; and

WHEREAS: The committee, in the course of its investigation, reviewed portions of the Georgia

Bureau of Investigation criminal file, including a video of the incident and recorded

interviews with witnesses, and other relevant materials; and

WHEREAS: On July 12, 2019, the committee delivered to me its recommendation that, based

on his actions on the morning of May 22, 2019, Sheriff Mark Cothren should be

suspended for a period of twenty days.

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS

GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

ORDERED: That pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 15-16-26. Mark Cothren is hereby suspended from the

Office of Sheriff of Bacon County for a period of twenty days, beginning Thursday,

July 18, 2019.

IT IS FURTHER

ORDERED: That pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 15-16-26(d), the Chief Judge of the Superior Court of

Bacon County shall appoint a person who meets the qualifications for sheriff pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 15-16-1 to assume the duties and responsibilities of the

office of sheriff during the period of suspension.
