A PROCLAMATION

BLACK HISTORY MONTH

WHEREAS:	In this national celebration, we applaud the transformational contributions of the African-American community, which has overcome tremendous adversity to build lasting change for generations to come; and
WHEREAS:	The State of Georgia is endlessly proud of her African-American sons and daughters, including our beloved Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Congressman John Lewis, Gladys Knight, Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas, Atlanta Mayor Keisha Lance Bottoms, and the many, countless heroes whose contributions are woven into our national fabric; and
WHEREAS:	In our country's recognition of Black History Month, we reflect on the great strides that we have made to ensure freedom for all people, regardless of race, color, or creed in the pursuit of life, liberty, and happiness – and we recognize that our work must continue; and
WHEREAS:	To preserve and build on this monumental progress for equality and freedom, we cannot rest on our laurels. Together, we must pledge to fight against injustice, prejudice, intolerance, and racism wherever it may be. In this collective effort, we can secure a safer, brighter Georgia and United States for our children; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim February 2019 as BLACK HISTORY MONTH in Georgia to encourage activities in honor of the contributions of African-Americans across the globe.
