A PROCLAMATION

CARIBBEAN AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH

WHEREAS:	Emigration from the Caribbean region to the American colonies began as early as 1619. Since then, millions of people have come from the Caribbean to the United States; and
WHEREAS:	People of Caribbean descent reside in every region of the United States and have influenced American culture, society, and government; and
WHEREAS:	The State of Georgia is one of the most culturally enriched and diverse states in the southeastern region of the United States. It is home to more than 250,000 people of Caribbean descent; and
WHEREAS:	Caribbean-Americans have made significant contributions to a variety of areas including education, fine arts, business, sports, and science; and
WHEREAS:	Caribbean-Americans played an active role in the civil rights movement and they continue to make important contributions to social and political issues facing our state and nation; and
WHEREAS:	For the fourteenth annual celebration of Caribbean American Heritage Month, the Georgia Caribbean American Heritage Coalition will showcase the Caribbean Spanish countries of Costa Rica, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Honduras, Panama, and Puerto Rico; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim June 2019 as CARIBBEAN HERITAGE MONTH in Georgia.
