A PROCLAMATION

CHILDREN'S VISION AND LEARNING MONTH

WHEREAS:	Students in the State of Georgia suffer from undiagnosed and untreated vision problems; and
WHEREAS:	As students and their parents prepare to start a new school year, they are met with an opportune time to focus on the importance of good vision and its connection to learning; and
WHEREAS:	According to the American Foundation for Vision Awareness, one in four school-age children have vision problems, and approximately 18 million children will not complete eye examinations with a certified vision care professional prior to entering school; and
WHEREAS:	The American Optometric Association estimates that sixty percent of students identified as "problem learners" have undetected vision problems; and
WHEREAS:	Every child deserves the opportunity to learn and achieve at their full potential; and
WHEREAS:	With proper eye care and treatment, we can help to ensure that students are able to achieve success in classrooms and beyond; and
WHEREAS:	Children's Vision and Learning Month is an opportunity to bring awareness to this important issue and educate parents, teachers, and the general public about the importance of good vision for Georgia's students; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim August 2019 as CHILDREN'S VISION AND LEARNING MONTH in Georgia.
