A PROCLAMATION

COLONIAL HERITAGE MONTH

WHEREAS:	Americans have an obligation to preserve the priceless legacy that these early arrivals left to all Americans; and
WHEREAS:	Citizens in every part of Georgia share a common interest in American history, and we honor the hardships and heroism of those who sought spiritual freedom and acknowledge those individuals whose lasting legacy of virtue, courage, and patriotism shaped the nation; and
WHEREAS:	These early colonists continue to inspire us, as they convey the true meaning of freedom by reminding us of our sacred obligation to love our country, obey its laws, respect its flag, and defend it against all enemies; and
WHEREAS:	Colonial Heritage Month provides an important opportunity for all citizens to learn more about the colonial heritage of our own state; and
WHEREAS:	Citizens are encouraged to observe this month as a means of reinforcing the legacy we have received and to help preserve the heritage with respect for the principles upon which the country was founded; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim October 2019 as COLONIAL HERITAGE MONTH in Georgia.
