Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma (DIPG) affects between 200 and

400 children in the United States each year; and

WHEREAS:

Brain tumors are the leading cause of cancer-related deaths in

children; and

WHEREAS:

DIPG is the second most common malignant brain tumor found in

children and the leading cause of childhood death due to brain

tumors; and

WHEREAS:

Prognosis has not improved for children with DIPG in more than

35 years, but new medical technology and research finally offer hope

for treatments for children afflicted with this disease; and

WHEREAS:

Georgia-based medical institutions are on the forefront of fighting

cancer and researching cures; and

WHEREAS:

The State of Georgia is pleased to help increase public awareness of

this deadly childhood cancer; now

I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby

proclaim May 17, 2019, as DIFFUSE INTRINSIC PONTINE

GLIOMA (DIPG) AWARENESS DAY in Georgia.
