## A PROCLAMATION

## ESOPHAGEAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS: The health and safety of all Georgians is vital to the well-being of our state's

families and communities; and

WHEREAS: Esophageal cancer is a disease of the esophageal tube that regularly results in

death. The disease is three-to-four times more prevalent in men than in women;

and

WHEREAS: With less than one in five patients surviving the disease, esophageal cancer is

among the deadliest forms of cancer. It is also one of the fastest-growing cancer

diagnoses in the United States; and

WHEREAS: Esophageal cancer can be a silent killer, as many patients are unaware that the

heartburn, difficulty swallowing, cough, hoarse voice, sore throat, and chest pain

that they are experiencing are reasons to be screened for the disease; and

WHEREAS: Esophageal cancer is often discovered during advanced stages, but it can be

prevented through early detection. If discovered early, chances for recovery and

survival are far better; and

WHEREAS: It is critical that all Georgians are aware of esophageal cancer, its symptoms, and

the value in early detection. Esophageal Cancer Awareness Month serves as an opportunity to raise awareness for the disease and advocate for additional

funding for research; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

April 2019 as ESOPHAGEAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
