## A PROCLAMATION

## FETAL ALCOHOL SPECTRUM DISORDERS AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS:	Children are our state's greatest resource and blessing. Fetal alcohol spectrum disorders
	threaten not only members of our younger generations, but all age groups, and pose a risk
	to the future of our state; and

- WHEREAS: Fetal alcohol spectrum disorders (FASD) is an umbrella term that describes several conditions that can occur in an individual whose mother drank alcohol during pregnancy. FASD may affect anyone, regardless of ethnicity, income, socioeconomic status, or education; and
- WHEREAS:According to the National Organization of Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, an estimated 40,000infants are born with FASD annually. FASD is 100 percent preventable when pregnant<br/>women abstain from alcohol during pregnancy; and

WHEREAS: FASD may contribute to numerous social issues and developmental disorders, including learning disabilities, scholastic failure, juvenile delinquency, homelessness, unemployment, mental illness and criminal behavior. Those with FASD are 19 times more likely to experience an intellectual disability, 7 times more likely to experience attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder, and 3 to 5 times more likely to experience a learning disability; and

- WHEREAS:FASD is commonly referred to as the "invisible disability." It can have a heightened impact<br/>on children in foster care and those in the custody of the Department of Juvenile Justice;<br/>and
- WHEREAS:Children and adults affected by FASD have the ability to succeed with proper treatment,<br/>appropriate strategies, interventions, and interdependence. Increased public awareness of<br/>the effects of prenatal consumption of alcohol for primary prevention and the need to<br/>support individuals with FASD and their families will contribute to the productive<br/>development of these individuals and help improve their family stability, quality of life, and<br/>general well-being; now
- **THEREFORE:**I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim September 9,<br/>2019, as FETAL ALCOHOL SPECTRUM DISORDERS AWARENESS DAY in<br/>Georgia.
