## A PROCLAMATION

## GIVE THANKS FOR THOSE WHO SERVED DAY

WHEREAS:	The first National Veterans Month was recognized nationally in November of 2018, and Veteran's Day is nationally observed on the eleventh day of the eleventh month; and
WHEREAS:	Georgia is home to over 700,000 military veterans of all eras; and
WHEREAS:	We owe an inexpressible debt to our current and past servicemen and servicewomen who have selflessly served so that we may live free; and
WHEREAS:	It is abundantly fitting and proper to honor the contributions and sacrifices of Georgia's veterans and their families on more than one day each year; and
WHEREAS:	Recognition of military service is a hallmark of America and central to positive morale for those currently serving and those who have served, along with their families and loved ones; and
WHEREAS:	The State of Georgia and United Military Care encourage all Georgians to take this time to remember and honor Georgia's veterans with grateful hearts for the contributions they have made while wearing the uniform of the United States Armed Forces; and
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim November 2, 2019 as GIVE THANKS FOR THOSE WHO SERVED DAY in Georgia.
