A PROCLAMATION

NEUROFIBROMATOSIS AWARENESS MONTH

- **WHEREAS:** Neurofibromatosis is a genetic disorder that causes tumors to form on nerve tissue including the brain, spinal cord, and nerves throughout the body; and
- **WHEREAS:** Over 125,000 Americans have been diagnosed with neurofibromatosis. The disorder is present in approximately one of every 3,000 births; and
- WHEREAS: Neurofibromatosis is characterized by a vast array of symptoms and can lead to learning disabilities, hearing impairments, loss of vision, bone abnormalities, disfigurement, severe pain, and cancer; and
- WHEREAS: Organizations across the State of Georgia and nation are actively striving to increase public awareness and advance research of Neurofibromatosis. The Children's Tumor Foundation develops collaborative partnerships with non-profits, patient registries, universities, labs, and hospitals to advance research efforts regarding the development of drug and medical treatments; and
- WHEREAS:Continued advocacy and public awareness of neurofibromatosis will help
to promote early diagnosis, proper management and treatment,
prevention of complications, and support for future research; now
- **THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 2019 as NEUROFIBROMATOSIS AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
