A PROCLAMATION

UTERINE FIBROID DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS:	Uterine fibroids, non-cancerous tumors found in the uterus, are one of the most common diseases of the female reproductive system; and
WHEREAS:	African American women are more likely to develop uterine fibroids and experience more severe symptoms than women of other races; and
WHEREAS:	Many women delay diagnosis and treatment for uterine fibroids despite experiencing severe symptoms; and
WHEREAS:	Many women undergo a hysterectomy as a treatment for uterine fibroids even though other options are now available to address the symptoms of uterine fibroids; and
WHEREAS:	Uterine fibroids cost the United States tens of billions of dollars annually due to hospitalizations, surgeries, physician visits, and lost productivity and absenteeism; and
WHEREAS:	Access to information and education is key to ensuring early diagnosis and proper treatment; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim July 2019 as UTERINE FIBROID DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
