Office of the Governor – Cost of Operations - To provide funds of \$1,500,000 to cover costs associated with water litigation.

Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency – To provide funds of \$5,500,000 to cover costs associated with 4 weather related storms. The disaster necessitated the coordination and delivery of state resources to assist local and state units of government to respond to the severe storms.

- February 26, 2016 – Severe thunderstorms, excessive rainfall and tornadoes resulted in damage in Baker, Carroll, Chattahoochee, Crawford, Dade, Decatur, Douglas, Fannin, Fayette, Gilmer, Greene, Haralson, Harris, Jeff Davis, Lamar, Macon, Marion, Meriwether, Montgomery, Morgan, Muscogee, Newton, Oglethorpe, Pickens, Stewart, Talbot, Taliaferro, Taylor, Towns, Troup, Upson, Webster, and Wilkes counties.
- October 4, 2016, - Hurricane Matthew with significant impacts of heavy winds and rain resulted in damage in Appling, Atkinson, Bacon, Brantley, Bryan, Bulloch, Burke, Camden, Candler, Charlton, Chatham, Clinch, Coffee, Echols, Effingham, Emanuel, Evans, Glynn, Jenkins, Jeff Davis, Liberty, Long, McIntosh, Pierce, Screven, Tattnall, Toombs, Treutlen, Ware, and Wayne counties.
- January 2, 2017 – Severe thunderstorms, excessive rainfall and tornadoes resulted in damage in Baker, Calhoun, Dougherty, Mitchell, Turner, and Worth Counties.
- January 24, 2017 - Severe thunderstorms, excessive rainfall and long track tornadoes resulted in numerous injuries and fatalities as well as property damage in Southwest and South Central Georgia.
