A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 4 of Chapter 13 of Title 19 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to the Family Violence and Stalking Protective Order Registry, so as to provide for
- 3 registration of pretrial release orders that prohibit contact with others issued in this state and
- 4 in foreign courts; to revise the short title; to revise definitions; to provide for conforming
- 5 references to the defined terms; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and
- 6 for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Article 4 of Chapter 13 of Title 19 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 10 Family Violence and Stalking Protective Order Registry, is amended by revising Code
- 11 Section 19-13-50, relating to the short title, as follows:
- *"*19-13-50.
- 13 This article shall be known and may be cited as the 'Family Violence and Stalking
- 14 Protective Order Registry Act."

15 SECTION 2.

- 16 Said article is further amended by revising paragraphs (3), (5), and (7) of Code Section
- 17 19-13-51, relating to definitions, as follows:
- 18 "(3) 'Foreign protective order' means any temporary protective order of protection,
- 19 protective order of protection, restraining order, or injunction, pretrial release order, or
- 20 <u>sentencing order</u> that prohibits <u>contact</u>, acts of family violence, or stalking or both issued
- 21 by a foreign court of competent jurisdiction in another state, territory, or tribal
- 22 jurisdiction in the United States."
- 23 "(5) 'Modification' means any amendment, dismissal, or continuance of a protective
- 24 order."
- 25 "(7) 'Protective order' means any:

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26 (A) An ex parte, temporary, six-month, permanent order, or restraining, pretrial release, or sentencing order issued by a judge in this state that prohibits contact or that 27 28 is pursuant to Code Sections 16-5-90 through 16-5-94 Article 7 of Chapter 5 of Title 29

16 or this chapter; and also where appropriate in this context includes a

30 (B) A foreign protective order."

31 **SECTION 3.**

- Said article is further amended by revising Code Section 19-13-52, relating to the purpose 32
- 33 of the registry, maintenance, access to information, and linking to National Crime
- Information Center Network, as follows: 34
- "19-13-52. 35
- 36 (a) The Georgia Protective Order Registry shall be created to serve as a state-wide,
- 37 centralized data base for state-wide the collection of protective orders issued pursuant to
- 38 Code Sections 16-5-90 through 16-5-94 and this chapter. The registry is intended to
- enhance victim safety by providing law enforcement officers, prosecuting attorneys, and 39
- the courts access to protective orders issued by the courts of this state and foreign courts 40
- 24 hours of the day and seven days of the week. Access to the registry is intended to aid 41
- 42 law enforcement officers, prosecuting attorneys, and the courts in the enforcement of
- 43 protective orders and the protection to victims of stalking and family violence.
- 44 (b) The registry shall be maintained by the Georgia Crime Information Center. The
- 45 Georgia Commission on Family Violence may consult with the Georgia Crime Information
- 46 Center regarding the effectiveness of the registry in enhancing the safety of victims of
- 47 domestic violence and stalking.
- (c) The registry shall include a complete and systematic record and index of all valid 48
- 49 protective orders and modifications thereof. Law enforcement officers and the courts shall
- 50 have access to the registry.
- (d) The registry shall be linked to the National Crime Information Center Network, and 51
- 52 protective orders or modifications thereof entered in the registry shall be immediately
- 53 transmitted to this such network."
- 54 **SECTION 4.**
- Said article is further amended by revising subsections (c) and (e) of Code Section 19-13-53, 55
- relating to standardized forms, timing of transmission of information and data entry, and the 56
- responsibility of sheriff's office, as follows: 57
- "(c) The Georgia Crime Information Center shall ensure that any protective order or 58
- 59 modification thereof is entered in the registry within 24 hours of receipt of the protective

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order or modification <u>thereof</u> from the clerk of court. The inability to enter information for

- all data fields in the registry shall not delay the entry of available information."
- 62 "(e) The entry of a protective order in the registry shall not be a prerequisite for
- enforcement of a valid protective order."

64 SECTION 5.

- 65 Said article is further amended by revising subsection (a) of Code Section 19-13-54, relating
- 66 to foreign protective orders, as follows:
- 67 "(a) A petitioner who obtains a valid foreign protective order may file that order by filing
- a certified copy of the foreign protective order with any clerk of court of the superior court
- 69 in this state."

70 **SECTION 6.**

- 71 Said article is further amended by revising subsection (a) of Code Section 19-13-56, relating
- 72 to liability of court or law enforcement personnel, as follows:
- 73 "(a) The state and any local or state law enforcement officer, court official, or official of
- 74 the registry shall be held harmless for any delay or failure to file a protective order or
- 75 <u>modification thereof</u>, to transmit information contained in <u>a</u> protective <u>orders</u> <u>order or</u>
- 76 <u>modification thereof</u>, or to enter such information in the registry."

77 SECTION 7.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
