AS PASSED

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 4 of Title 38 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
2 relating to the Department of Veterans Service, so as to require maintenance of a women
3 veterans' office by the commissioner of veterans service; to provide for the purposes of such
4 women veterans' office; to require interaction with veterans court divisions to assist with
5 recruiting and training mentors; to require an annual report; to provide for related matters;
6 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:**

8 **SECTION 1.**

9 Article 1 of Chapter 4 of Title 38 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
10 Department of Veterans Service, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as
11 follows:

12 "38-4-13.

13 The commissioner of veterans service shall, in addition to the other duties provided in this
14 chapter, maintain a women veterans' office. Such office shall conduct outreach to women
15 veterans for the purpose of improving awareness of eligibility for federal and state veterans'
16 benefits and services, conduct assessments of the specific needs of women veterans with
17 respect to benefits and services, and review programs, research projects, and other
18 initiatives designed to address or meet the specific needs of women veterans in this state.

19 The women veterans' office shall work with veterans court divisions as provided for in
20 Code Section 15-1-17 to assist with recruiting and training women veterans to serve as
21 mentors for veterans participating in these court divisions. In the annual report provided
22 for under Code Section 38-4-11, the commissioner of veterans service shall specifically
23 report on the office provided for under this Code section."

24 **SECTION 2.**

25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
