


2015 CCRPI Overview

On May 3, the GaDOE will release the 2014-2015 CCRPI.¹ This year’s CCRPI includes several important changes, including the inclusion of the Georgia Milestones for the first time and an increase in the weight of student growth from 25 to 40 points. At the state level, the number of “A” and “B” schools decreased in 2014-2015, and the number of “C,” “D,” and “F” schools increased, as seen in Figure 1 below. The statewide CCRPI average decreased from 73.5 to 72.1 from 2013-2014 to 2014-2015.²



This decrease was anticipated given the higher expectations of the Georgia Milestones assessments and closer alignment of student performance expectations with NAEP performance levels. On average, elementary schools decreased by 2.6 points and middle schools by 4.6 points since 2013-2014. High schools increased by 5.2 points, largely because high schools already had more challenging math assessments and graduation rates are higher than Georgia Milestones performance. In this year’s CCRPI, the academic performance component weight decreased from 60 to 50 points. In addition, schools were given partial credit when students performed at the developing level, full credit for students in the proficient level, and extra points for students in the distinguished level instead of only measuring the percentage of students who are proficient or higher.

In conjunction with the new CCRPI, GOSA plans to do the following:

- Release an updated list of Failing or Probationary schools for the Opportunity School District,
- Publish its new interactive school grades website with parent-friendly reports (roughly two weeks after public CCRPI release),
- Award Highest Performing and Greatest Gains school awards (same date as school grades release), and
- Calculate the district Financial Efficiency Star Rating to be released by the GaDOE.

The remainder of this document provides summary data for each item and outlines GOSA’s release plans.

¹ The release was delayed an additional month due to a minor calculation error affecting only 1,300 EL students statewide. Most school scores were unaffected, but some school scores with high EL populations had larger changes.
² This average is calculated as a simple average of all schools’ CCRPI single score in each year, excluding primary schools because they did not receive a 2015 score. The GaDOE applies the CCRPI formula statewide rather than averaging school scores, which yields an increase from 72.3 to 75.5 from 2013-2014 to 2014-2015. This increase is largely because the state earns more Challenge Points than many schools since it meets most of the new Performance Flag targets set for the Georgia Milestones. These targets are set at the state average for each assessment by subgroup, so by definition, the state will meet most targets in this first baseline year.

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Opportunity School District (OSD) Eligibility Changes for 2014-2015 Release

Schools earning a school grade of F (CCRPI less than 60) for three consecutive years are eligible for the OSD. Those deemed failing for two consecutive years are classified as Probationary.

With the new release of the CCRPI, the preliminary list of schools eligible for the OSD decreases from 139 to 127. The schools are listed in Table 1 below. Nineteen schools that are newly eligible, and 31 schools are no longer eligible (Listed in Table 2 and 3, respectively). In addition, there are 65 schools that are Probationary, as seen in Table 4.³

*In March 2016, the State Charter Commission voted to close Ivy Preparatory Young Men's Leadership Academy School effective for the 2016-2017 school year.

³ This list does not take into account school closures and mergers that occurred during the 2015-2016 school year. GOSA will update the list of failing schools in line with its [School Code Change Policy](#) once it receives school code changes from the GaDOE in the coming months.

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Notable Changes to the OSD-Eligible List

- Atlanta (5 fewer) and Clayton (3 fewer) had the largest decreases. DeKalb (3 more) and Fulton (3 more) had the largest increases.
- More than three-fourths of OSD-Eligible schools (100 of 127) are concentrated in six districts (Atlanta, Bibb, DeKalb, Fulton, Muscogee, and Richmond).
- Clayton, Green, Hancock, and Taliaferro Counties no longer have any eligible schools.
- Calhoun, Chattahoochee, and Spalding Counties now have eligible schools. Graduation Achievement Academy, a state charter virtual school, is also new to the list.
- Macon and Randolph Counties previously had all three schools in their systems eligible but now only have one school each.
