The field further developed during the Second World War as insurance companies began to employ nurses and social workers to facilitate care for the soldiers returning from war; and

WHEREAS: Facilities ranging from hospitals, insurance companies, rehabilitation facilities, home health agencies, and managed care organizations will sponsor local educational events to commemorate Case Management Week; and

WHEREAS: Thousands of Georgians have benefited from the dedicated and compassionate care they received from case managers. Our state is proud to commend the men and women who are committed to improving the health and well-being of our citizens; and

WHEREAS: The week of October 9–15, 2016, serves to educate the public about case management and increase recognition of the significant contributions of case managers to quality health care for patients, health care providers, and payers; now

THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim October 9–15, 2016, as CASE MANAGEMENT WEEK in Georgia.
