WHEREAS: Many dedicated child care professionals in our state are voluntarily participating in Quality Rated, Georgia's tiered quality rating and improvement system, to ensure children enrolled in their programs receive the best possible care; and

WHEREAS: The future of our state depends on the quality of care provided to young children today, and the citizens of the State of Georgia recognize child care program administrators, teachers, and support staff for their hard work and commitment to our state's most precious entity: our children; now
